Ramp taxiway markings. Last evening arriving at the new Terminal A in EWR, Ramp Control instructed us to taxi A8, L3, A9 to Gate XX. The weather was rainy and the ground was wet. These conditions make it very difficult to see the myriad of Taxiway J-lines and markings on the ground at new Terminal A. To add to this difficulty the paint is now starting to wear off, and with the glare from the terminal lights, seeing the J-lines is nearly impossible until you are right on top of them.

## **SYNOPSIS**

Air carrier Captain reported the taxiway lines and markings at the new Terminal A in EWR were difficult to see at night, especially in rainy conditions due to the glare from terminal lights. The paint lines were also starting to wear off, adding to the difficulty.
