NARRATIVE 1	

During taxi out from HOU, we were assigned taxi instructions of "taxi to Runway 31L via Zulu to Charlie, cross Runway 4 on Charlie." We followed these instructions but became confused at the area where C intersects Taxiway M. In this location, Taxiway C makes about a 45-degree left turn, but the yellow taxi line disappears. It appears that the paint has been scoured off here. Additionally, this area of the airport is very dark, making the taxiways very hard to interpret. As we approached this area, the only line that we could see was Taxiway M. We almost missed our turn on to C because of these conditions.

Obscured/missing taxiway markings create safety hazard. Either the yellow taxi line for C needs to be repainted, or ATC needs to assign a routing of C to M for taxi-outs to Runway 31L.

## **SYNOPSIS**

Air carrier Captain reported the yellow taxi line disappears at a taxiway intersection at HOU resulting in the flight crew nearly missing a turn. Captain cited inadequate lighting as contributing.
