MMGL is in the process of constructing a new runway that parallels Runway 11/29. There are operations alerts advising crews of taxiway changes, but there is nothing alerting crews of a new runway.

When arriving on the ILS Z Runway 29 the runway became visible around 2000 ft. AGL. Around that time, I noticed the runway under construction, which had touchdown zone markings. In situations of lower visibility and higher crosswinds, there is a threat of landing on the wrong runway. Please advise crews of the new runway being constructed.

SYNOPSIS

Air carrier First Officer reported there was no alert regarding the construction of the new parallel runway at MMGL/GDL, which currently has touchdown zone markings. The reporter stated that during arrival, there can be potential confusion for pilots to land on the wrong runway.
