NARRATIVE 1	

I discovered during preflight the main entry door handle rubbing/grinding/binding against the door and it took excess force to open the handle. This is a repeat issue where I discovered several E models with the same issue this past spring. Again my main concern is the door can go from simply requiring a little extra force to taking both hands and almost bending it from my experience being temporarily trapped with owners on board this past spring. The possibility of egress being impaired with the combination of questionable brakes is an extreme safety concern and is still a problem with new aircraft coming from Embraer and crews are unaware of the possibility of becoming stuck in till it happens to them.

Inspect all E model doors immediately to ensure correct installation and service.
