Taxiway M5 at YVR is closed for repairs. This is the primary exit when landing on Runway 08L. Further, the cones that denote the taxiway is closed are not immediately visible from the runway during the landing rollout.

The M5 closure is listed in the NOTAMs section in Jepp FD. It is not listed on the YVR ATIS. This is a threat because pilots are used to seeing taxiway closures of significance in the ATIS. Fortunately, we had reviewed the NOTAMs during cruise and the Tower Controller advised us of the taxiway closure. However, I can envision a scenario where pilots do not notice the NOTAM and assume M5 is open. If it is night or raining a pilot may turn onto M5 and become trapped.

SYNOPSIS

Air carrier Captain reported the cones that denote a closed taxiway at YVR are not immediately visible from the runway during the landing rollout and the closure is also not listed on the airport ATIS.
